Prerequisite coursework must be completed prior to enrollment in the TTUHSC El Paso Gayle Greve Hunt School of Nursing. Courses must be completed with a grade of “C” or better. Course work may be completed at any regionally accredited college or university, but must be evaluated for Texas Core compliance prior to transfer. A maximum of 15 credit hours may be earned through credit by examination, excluding lab sciences courses.

Admitted students will be required to reside in or around El Paso, TX for the duration of the 16 month program. Students may enroll in the TTUHSC El Paso Gayle Greve Hunt School of Nursing after admission. Full-time enrollment is required throughout the program. Students must maintain a 2.0 cumulative grade point average in order to graduate. Because of the rigorous nature and intensity of the program, students are strongly discouraged from working while enrolled.

Applications for admission may be accessed at www.ttuhschool.edu/elpaso/son. Please see website for specific application deadlines. Applications are reviewed individually and academic criteria are important factors. No single academic criterion determines selection for admission.

Financial Information

Academic Criteria

- At time of application submission, 44 credit hours must be completed of the required prerequisite courses, including all four lab sciences, which include A&P I, A&P II, Microbiology, and Chemistry.
- A minimum cumulative GPA of 2.5 is required for all grades earned at all regionally accredited colleges/universities.
- All prerequisite courses should be completed with a grade of “C” or better prior to enrollment in nursing courses.
